The service is endorsed and used by law enforcement and leading organizations worldwide. In the UK, it is recommended by eBay when buying second hand cellular phones.

Every check includes a printable comprehensive history report showing all the information available on the system. Anyone checking a cellular phone also can verify whether the phone has been disabled by network carriers worldwide. CheckMEND is particularly relevant for mobile devices as they top the list for items sold via online auction sites.

The CheckMEND system continually acquires data in real time on all aspects of personal property ownership and associated criminality from feeds worldwide. At an average rate of more than 150,000 records a week, it is the most comprehensive system of its kind.

- Cybercrime costs the US \$4 billion a year
