

LAUNCHES IN US TO CURB CYBERCRIME OF SELLING SUSPECT SECOND HAND GOODS

- Checks can be carried out by entering a serial or identification number.

- Within seconds, CheckMEND is able to tell the user if the item has had previous owners (a common fraud is to sell refurbished goods as new), is reported stolen or lost, has been subject to an insurance claim and, in the case of cellular phones, if the phone is barred or has had its identity altered - all information that may be relevant to a prospective purchaser.
- Sellers can enhance the item they are selling by running a check before listing and then by quoting the report reference. Any buyer can see the report online by quoting the reference number on the CheckMEND site.
- Items can be reported as stolen to CheckMEND by the public via www.immobilize.net which also hosts the world's largest possession ownership database with more than 20 million registered users worldwide.
